GOVERNMENT EARMARKS TWO CDC PROJECTS FOR STATE FUNDING



Two CDC projects worth approximately 100 Billion FCFA obtain maturation visa from the Ministry of Economy, Planning and Regional Development, (MINEPAT). The first is the construction of a new Oil Mill in Idenau and a Rubber Factory

in Pendamboko while the second is the supply of agricultural/earth moving equipment. This was the outcome of the 2nd Session of the Inter-Ministerial Committee of Experts charged with the examination of 12 (twelve) public investment projects from different entities in Yaounde, 30th July, 2021. These projects in principle have crossed an important threshold for funding by the State, sole shareholder of the CDC.

Chairing the meeting, the Minister Delegate in charge of Planning in the Ministry of Economy, Planning and Regional Development, Mr. Paul Tasong, stated that government through these investments intend to boost CDC's

production and processing of crops for better quality, better extraction rate and more downstream products.

The CDC has remained true to its mission of contributing to the national economy and improving the livelihoods of many Cameroonians. It is hoped that these two projects and their accompanying benefits will enable the CDC produce more, become sustainable and make profits.
